MANILA TYTANA COLLEGES Frequently Asked Questions

I. Admission

1. What is the process for admission?

- a. Secure application form from the Admissions Section and pay the application fee of P300.00 at the Cashier. Submit the application form to the Admissions Section to get a schedule of the MTC Admission Test (MTCAT). Interested parties may also apply online via www.mtc.edu.ph.
- b. Take the MTCAT on the scheduled date at the Guidance and Testing Department.
- c. Students who will pass the MTCAT will be scheduled for interview with the College Dean. Proceed to the College Dean for interview.
- d. Submit documentary requirements to the Admissions Section.
- e. Proceed to Cashier to pay reservation/tuition fee.
- f. Proceed to Guidance and Testing Department for schedule of Freshmen Orientation

2. Who can apply for admission? Should an interested applicant personally apply for admission?

All fourth year high school students (or equivalent), high school graduates, currently college undergraduates, and college graduates may apply for admission. The general policy requires that applicants personally apply for admission. However, special cases like foreign students who are currently abroad may be represented by their parent/quardian.

3. What are the documents required for admission at MTC?

Initially, applicants are required to submit the duly-accomplished application form and four (4) 2x2" recent ID photos on white background, other documents to follow.

For Freshmen

- a. Duly-accomplished Application Form
- b. Form 138 (High School Card)
- c. Certificate of Good Moral Character issued by high school attended
- d. Certified True Copy of Birth Certificate issued by the National Statistics Office (NSO)
- e. Four (4) 2x2" recent ID photos on white background

For Transferees / Second Undergraduate Degree Applicants

- a. Duly-accomplished Application Form
- b. Transcript of Records or certification of subjects taken duly-issued by school last attended
- c. Course description of subjects taken
- d. Certificate of Good Moral Character

- e. Honorable Dismissal (from school last attended)
- f. Certified True Copy of Birth Certificate issued by the National Statistics Office (NSO)
- g. Four (4) 2x2" recent ID pictures on light background

For Foreign Students

- a. Duly-notarized letter of request from the applicant
- b. Duly-notarized General Application Form accomplished by the applicant (BI Form: No. MCL-07-01 available at the College Registrar's Office)
- c. Duly-notarized letter of acceptance and endorsement letter from the College Registrar
- d. Recent one (1) piece of 2x2 and one (1) piece of 1x1 colored ID pictures
- e. Medical Certificate (Examination should be done at the Bureau of Quaratine.)
- f. High school records and Diploma
- g. Completion records of 11th or 12th Grade (as per DECS Order No. 26, s. 1994)
- h. Transfer of records for those who attended college in other countries
- Transfer Credentials and Transcript of Records for transferees from other Philippine Higher Institutions (HEIs)
- j. Photocopy of applicant's passport bio-page, latest admission and authorized to stay
- h. Foreign Student Fee
- i. National Intelligence Coordinating Agency Clearance (Form available at the College Registrar's Office.)
- j. Application Fee at the BI for the first year
- k. Application of ACRI-CARD (Secure application from BI then submit 2x2 picture)

Cross Enrollees

- a. Permit to cross enroll issued by the present school
- b. Duly accomplished Application Form
- c. Four (4) pcs. 2x2" recent ID pictures on light background

4. Is there a cut off grade for admission?

There is no cut-off grade for admission. Applicants with high grades in high school and high scores in the MTCAT have better chances of being accepted.

5. How much is the physical examination fee?

The physical examination fee of P₄50.00 is already incorporated in the student's matriculation fee. The physical examination is not part of the admission process. However, all incoming students will have to undergo the physical examination before or during the start of the semesters as scheduled by the school clinic.

6. Are new students (freshmen and transferees) allowed to enroll during second semester?

Yes. New students still have to undergo the admission process.

II. MTC Admission Test

7. What is MTCAT?

The MTC Admission Test is an achievement-type test covering primary and secondary education learning. It involves testing the student's mental ability, as well as one's cumulative learning in English, Science and Math subjects.

8. When is the MTC Admission Test being conducted?

The MTCAT is scheduled from Monday to Friday, 8AM-4PM. It is administered by the Guidance and Testing Department. However, the College also accepts walk-in applicants. Qualifiers are notified of the results few minutes after the exam.

9. What are the available payment schemes?

IV. Scholarships and Financial Aid

11. What are the available scholarships programs in MTC?

There are two kinds of scholarships in MTC: the MTC Assist Grant-in-Aid, for financially-disadvantaged but deserving students; and the MTC Excel, which is solely based on merit or for academically excellent students. The grants range from tuition fee discounts to full tuition and miscellaneous fees coverage + financial assistance on living expenses.

From North NCR area, take the MRT or any PUB with SM MOA signage, get off at Taft Avenue Station. Take the orange cab in front of Metropoint Mall.

From North NCR/Manila area, take the LRT, get off at Gi Puyat Station. Take the blue/orange cab in front of JAC Liner Bus Station.

From South NCR area (Paranaque, Las Pinas), take any PUJ with Baclaran signage, get off at Heritage Hotel. Take the PUJ located in front of San Juan de Dios College.

From South area (Cavite), take any PUB with Coastal signage, get off at Heritage Hotel. Take the PUJ located in front of San Juan de Dios College.

From South area (Laguna), take any PUB with Buendia signage, get off at Gil Puyat LRT Station. Take the blue/orange cab in front of JAC Liner Bus Station.
